Johanneson's smoked salmon, Charlie Nurre's handcrafted wine, and Gary Lindner for...getting there!


January Program Meeting has Moved

Our Donation at Work for SI

Remember last spring when our club sent \$400 to the Birthing in the Pacific effort? Soroptimist International President Alice Wells reports that over \$270,000 has been raised so far, and she's selected the BIP effort for a second year in her SI President's Appeal. Money raised has been used for training programs completed by 24 village birth attendants, 16 doctors and midwives, and 7 community health workers. 15,000 obstetric wheels have been printed to help pregnant women calculate their due date and plan their delivery; 120 essential tools for safe delivery and 90 training dolls and simulators have been purchased or donated. Soroptimist is making a difference! Every day in Papua New Guinea three women die in childbirth or from complications of pregnancy. With only 278 registered midwives in the entire national healthcare system (in a country of over 7 million people), the Australian government has

now committed to fund nursing and midwifery scholarships. There is no doubt whatsoever that Soroptimist does indeed improve the lives of women in our world!
